

This year 14th February marks two significant occurrences. The one that most people will be aware of is, of course, St Valentine's day when we think of love, and the other (which happens to fall on 14th February this year) is Ash Wednesday – when we also think of love!

More about Ash Wednesday later, but first what do we know about St Valentine? Well according to my trusty Oxford Book of Saints, St Valentine was around in the 3rd century. He was a priest or a bishop (we're not entirely sure as there are two Valentines listed but they could be one and the same person) and was martyred in Rome in about 269 AD. There is no clear connection with Valentine and lovers but a probable reason is that this was the date in mediaeval times that it is believed that birds mated. On the other hand some see the custom of choosing a partner on St Valentine's Day as a leftover of the Roman Lupercalia festival, which took place in the middle of February. No churches in England are dedicated to St Valentine but from 1835 his relics are claimed by the Carmalite church in Dublin with his feast day being 14th February.

This year, because of the moveable feast of Easter, we mark the beginning of Lent on 14th February – Ash Wednesday, the day after we eat lots of pancakes. The reason I say that we think of love on that day is because throughout the six weeks of Lent we spend time in the Christian Church in study and prayer as we walk with Christ to the cross and acknowledge and give thanks for that ultimate act of love – Christ's death on the cross, a selfless sacrifice of himself for us.

God's greatest commandment for us is to love the Lord and to love one another. And so on 14th February as we celebrate St Valentine and perhaps while buying cards for those we love, we should also remember at the beginning of Lent the love that is greater than any other, a love that knows no bounds, God's love for each and every one of us. An unconditional love and, in the words of Mark Darcy in 'Love Actually' a love that loves us 'just as we are'!

OUTCOME OF THE PASS-IT-ON CAMPAIGN

Although the Pass-It-On campaign of October/ November 2017 did not complete until past the deadline for the last edition it is worth publishing the results. 

Democracy is a fragile bloom which has taken many centuries to grow. Without the interest and concern of the people it could wither and die overnight.

The first Parliaments to petition the King and to grant him the right to take extra taxes were held in the 13th century, and Dorchester first sent Members to Parliament in 1295.

The pattern was – and so remained until the 19th century – that each County sent to the House of Commons two Knights of the Shire, and each Borough sent two Burgesses. Parliament met when called by the King, and usually sat only for a few weeks.

As the economy grew, the richer townsmen and the country gentry fumed at the restrictions placed on them by the King's Ministers. These frictions were made worse by the conflicting emotions of true religion - and war between King and Parliament ensued in the 1640s. Parliament's victory was apparently extinguished by the Restoration of Charles II in 1660, but the seeds had been well-sown. The expulsion of James II in 1688 was followed by Parliament's invitation to the Dutch prince William of Orange (with his English wife Mary) to take the throne. From then on Parliament was the supreme force in the land.

It was not, of course, democratic. The House of Lords (the old Great Council) became hereditary. The two Knights of each Shire were elected by the larger landholders, and each borough elected their MPs by whatever was the tradition locally. Voting was comparatively rare, because it was expensive: it was necessary to bribe voters, and much more convenient for an arrangement to be made between the leading political families.

In 18th Century Dorchester, voters had to be adult males holding property in the borough and paying church and poor rates. The Earl of Shaftesbury owned many houses and plots in the town, and his tenants obediently supported the candidates he favoured. There was no secret ballot so they could not do otherwise. Aspiring young politicians could get into Parliament by gaining the patronage of borough controllers like Shaftesbury.



The Borough of Weymouth and Melcombe Regis returned four Members because it had been originally two separate boroughs. It also had a very wide franchise, rather vaguely estimated at 648 voters. Each voter had four votes, and it was assumed that each of these was a valuable asset which could be sold. Elections were very popular with voters and non-voters alike because candidates would throw largesse in all directions. Beer, bread and money flowed in the streets, while respectable householders cowered behind their shutters. Weymouth became a byword for corrupt elections, and each election was followed by petitions by defeated candidates to the House of Commons for the unseating of those who had won.

In a century of reform from 1830 to 1929, representation of the people in the House of Commons was drastically changed. Corruption was largely wiped out by the secret ballot from 1872, excess seats were re-distributed, and qualification to vote was gradually extended down the social train. There is now one member for West Dorset including Dorchester and one for South Dorset including Weymouth.

In the Winterborne Valley most men only gained the vote in the 1880s, though women had to wait until 1918 and finally until 1928 for full qualification on the same basis as men.

In 1885 Lord Randolph Churchill came down to the Corn Exchange in Dorchester to support the Tory candidate. Speaking rather pompously he said: "I have been accused of calling the Dorset labourers' the scum of the earth"".
