The

The most famous poem in the English language is **'Daffodils'** by William Wordsworth, and although by the time you read this the daffodils will have all but finished perhaps for you, like Wordsworth, they will still fill your heart with pleasure. Even after the memory of them fades we know we can still look forward to next spring when the daffodils will dance again.

Each one of the seasons has its own beauty of course but I believe that spring is special. One only has to look around at the spring flowers lighting up the still bare landscape and see the fresh green buds beginning to burst open to feel the heart soar and gain a sense of newness and hope.

As I write this we are one week away from the glorious celebration of Christ's resurrection on Easter Day. On Easter Sunday all our churches will be awakened from their Lenten solemnity and will be wonderfully embellished with the most beautiful floral displays (thanks to our talented teams of flower arrangers) in celebration of the Risen Lord. All around us we see signs of newness bursting into life.

I'm reminded of The Carpenters' song, **'We've only just begun'** which at this time of year offers a simple but wonderful synopsis of the message at the heart of the gospel. It goes on to say:

"Before the risin' sun, we fly, So many roads to choose, We'll start out walkin' and learn to run, (And yes, we've just begun)".

Whoever we are, whatever we face, God holds out the prospect of a fresh start, of new hoizons that beckon us onwards.

This glorious Eastertide, which, in the Church's calendar goes on all through May until Pentecost on 9th June, continues the joy of Easter Day reminding us that each and every day is a new beginning. The witnesses to the first Easter slowly came to realise that, from an awful ending (the death of our Lord Jesus Christ), had come a new beginning, not just for Jesus but for everyone. Joy, hope, purpose and love, which had been buried with Jesus in the tomb, came leaping back to life; the future that a moment ago had seemed so empty was suddenly brimming over with promise.

Such is the hope of spring, offering signs of new life all around us, and in this wonder that is God's creation we are invited to live each moment in the context of the God who makes all things new; the God who enables us confidently to declare: we've only just begun.


A Play by Vince Jones

On Monday March 18th we were given a fascinating presentation by Rod Harris, who had carried out extensive research into "The Portland Spies". The group of five spies was one of the most important KGB spy rings of the Cold War and was centred on Portland. They stole secret information from the Navy's top secret Underwater Defence Establishment (UDE) at Portland relating to Britain's first nuclear submarine, HMS Dreadnought. The five spies - Gordon Lonsdale, Lorna and Maurice Kroger, Harry Houghton and Ethel Gee (Bunty) - operated from a building at Portland Port. Harry Houghton and Ethel Gee, the two key British members of the ring, were arrested in 1961. In November 2017 MI5 released 280

papers about the case and all the information is in the Public Records Office.

GARDEN AND CRAFT SHOW N SUNDAY 18th August 2019 at Martinstown Village Hall.

Gardens are beginning to flourish now and it's time for all our gardeners, cooks, bakers and crafters to think about what you will enter in this year's show. We must not forget that this is a village show because the standard of entries is always remarkably high.

Here are some hints and tips for the presentation of fruits and vegetables:

VARTINSTOWN

Care in presentation is important e.g. onion roots trimmed, tops tied, carrots and potatoes cleaned (but not too scrubbed) etc. If a class has more than one item, 3 apples for example, put in apples that look very similar in size and appearance.

Always check the current show schedule and stick to the rules. Check the wording e.g. Any Other Vegetable means a single vegetable not in any other class. If in doubt, contact a member of the committee for clarification.

In mixed classes, consideration may be given to perceived difficulty in cultivation.

Flowers and pot plants: Make sure flowers are all in their prime and snip off any that aren't; the same applies to leaves and always check underneath. With pots, remove any debris from the compost so your exhibit looks at its best.

During the months before the show, pinch out pot plants to encourage compact, strong growth and lots of flowers.

Entry forms for the Show are in the middle of the Schedule that came inside this magazine, still available in the Village Shop and the church in Martinstown.

Dorchester in America

In April 1630 William Whiteway of Dorchester casually noted in his diary, '*The beginning of this moneth, many of this towne went to plant in New England and among the rest mrs Sandford*'.

In this brief sentence Whiteway recorded the real beginning of long-term settlement from England in Massachusetts Bay, and the establishment of an empire in America. That empire was to grow into thirteen colonies along a thousand-mile coastline. A hundred and fifty years later those colonies rebelled against rule from London and became the United States of America.

The 'planting' referred to was dangerous and primitive. In 1608 the expedition from London to settle in Virginia, 500 miles further south, warmer and more fertile, had very nearly failed as the colonists starved, sickened and died. The 'Pilgrim Fathers'who in 1620 established New Plymouth in the south of Massachusetts Bay, sought to create a community where they could live according to their Puritan principles and they too suffered great hardship but survived. Their example enlivened others: in particular the Rector of Dorchester, John White.

John White had already worked a

transformation in Dorchester. His powerful eloquence had persuaded the authorities to 'purify' the town, repressing dissolute behaviour while creating public services for those in need. However, he was in constant conflict with the tons and large for her time, but crowded with 140 passengers (including Mrs Sandford) and 50 crew, as well as a herd of cattle. After several weeks at sea they missed the intended landfall but settled for a desolate promontory with muddy creeks and salt marshes. Initially they put up tents and built wigwams, and ate rations brought from the ship.

And they named their new town 'Dorchester'.

They bought corn from the local Indians, and caught fish. Sickness spread rapidly and when they built log cabins there were several house fires. The first winter they were reduced to eating clams, mussels and nuts. A relief ship from England arrived just in time to prevent starvation.

It was a 'godly' community. Decisions were taken communally in a specially-built Meeting House, but it was not a liberal democracy. Strict religious and social rules were established, and dissent was not permitted. Occasionally there were expulsions, and a breakaway group headed west to the Connecticut river where they started yet another town called 'Dorchester', though this was soon changed to 'Windsor', possibly from Broadwindsor.

Meanwhile the first settlers cleared the wilderness and created open fields which were farmed communally. Small plots were developed around the new wooden houses. As more settlers arrived from England, similar settlements sprang up along the coast and inland – Weymouth, Sherborn and Wareham for example. Dorset had

arrived in America!

Just to the north of Dorchester was the settlement that became Boston. It was more prosperous and grew to be the major city it is today. Dorchester became a suburb, flourishing at first, then in decay and now flourishing once more. Although part of Boston it maintains its historical independence. Connections between our Dorchester and theirs deserve to be strengthened. If you are holidaying in the area, drop in to the town museum and tell them where you live – you'll be welcome!

Established Church, and felt inspired by the idea of creating a godly community beyond the control of the Bishops. In the pulpit he urged the businessmen of Dorchester to invest their money in the Massachusetts Bay Company, which was created to set up godly communities on the east coast of America.

The first ship to sail in 1630 with emigrants was the 'Mary and John' – 400






