For all sorts of reasons this period can sometimes take quite a few months. Revd. Jean Saddington is no longer our vicar but is continuing her ministry as a Chaplain at Dorset County Hospital. She has secured a new home in our Valley so we shall see her from time to time either walking Mabel, her dog, or at the various local activities or groups.

During this period our Ministry Staff and Churchwardens will liaise with our Rector, Keith, to ensure that we have adequate cover for services and that pastoral care continues. Do feel free to contact any of us should you feel the need.

On a practical level service times and venues will continue but with some slight changes in the nature of some services.

There will be no Changes to the usual services at Winterbourne Abbas, Compton Valence or Winterbourne Steepleton. The only change at Martinstown will be that there will not be a Eucharist on the third Sunday of each month. This will replaced by a service of Matins.

Let us resolve to do all we can to ensure that our Churches remain alive, vibrant and active.














Winterbourne Abbas & Steepleton Parish Council

At last month's Parish Council meeting, our new Chairman Tony Hancox (Abbas) and vice Chairman Peter Norbury (Steepleton) were elected together with a new councillor Ellie Sturrock who was coopted to replace retiring Steepleton councillor Richard Crumbleholme. The group council has three members from each village. Richard Crumbleholme has been appointed as Parish Clerk after the retirement of Stephen Slade who had been clerk for over 50 years.

A review of the past year noted that the massive National Grid VIP pylon removal project was nearing completion. Although disruptive, the villages have benefitted from National Grid's community funding with a solar powered Speed Indictor Device and part funding of stream cleaning in Steepleton. The National Grid's contractor Morgan Sindall very generously donated their defibrillator, which has now been sited at the filling station in Abbas. The parish council will insure and maintain both these pieces of equipment. Crime levels have been low in both villages and no serious flooding has been experienced.

Refurbishment of the bus shelters and village seats is taking place over this summer. A meeting has been arranged with National Highways and Dorset Highways to address various issues in Abbas relating to the busy A35 trunk road, these include speeding and maintenance of the leat and surface water drainage.

Defibrillator at Winterbourne Abbas

Due to the initial idea and efforts of local villagers, the National Grid's contractor Morgan Sindall very generously donated an automated defibrillator to the village. The Parish Council obtained the approval of the Motor Fuel Group to site the unit at their garage / filling station in Abbas. After obtaining a new battery and pads, the unit has been sited externally to the right hand side of the shop entrance near the Amazon pick up point. It has been registered with the national database to allow emergency services to use it as well as the general public on a 24/7 basis. The Parish Council has undertaken to maintain and insure the unit.

Later, on a perfect, sunny day of the 22nd June, 37 people travelled via the New Forest and its ponies to Beaulieu, where they enjoyed a day featuring a tremendous mix different attractions.

The motor museum itself had a splendid display of vehicles through the years including early

electric ones (which were not a success due to problems with battery charging) right up to todays BMW Mini.

There was an impressive, recently installed sculpture exhibition both in the grounds and palace and ornamental gardens as well as productive ones, with various walks around the grounds, plus a large lake the far side of the house. Most of the group enjoyed a trip on the vintage bus and monorail. The house itself had many interesting displays including family memorabilia of previous coronations including the recent one of Charles III, a few weeks prior to our visit.

Did you know: Poundbury Garden centre is now recycling candle wax and old compost bags. And Dorchester Transport Action Group are holding a car free day on September 22nd 2023. Did you know: the water taken to produce any item is called the 'embedded water usage'? And that the embedded water in the manufacture of one car is between 500,000 and 1 million litres, of one pair of jeans 10,850 litres and of one sheet of paper 10 litres. And that there are in total 326 quintillion gallons = 1233.91 quintillion liters of water on earth? Of which 90% salt, and the rest fresh.

These facts and many more have come from the Green Living Project that 7 Martinstowners have just completed. The project was a great community effort and we had a lot of fun. This was surprising as much of what we were learning was guite shocking. For instance, did you know that aviation accounts for 5% of all global emissions. And that supermarkets put gas (with chemicals) in the sealed clear plastic bags/ sachets in which they sell veg or fruit. And that maps of sea projections show that the whole length of the Chesil bank and much of Weymouth and Bridport will be under water by 2050. And – a sobering portrait of human nature - that while over 50% of the population are more concerned about the effects of flying than 5 years ago, only 8% actually fly less! However, all of us have made different practical changes to our daily lives as a direct result of the group meetings, and are now more conscious about what we

use and consume, where it comes from and the impact it can have. We met for an evening a month at one another's homes taking it in turns to facilitate the evening, and ended in the pub. Green Martinstown's supper evening this year is on Saturday October 28th and we will among other things be presenting some of what we have learnt in the Green Living Project in a fun way.

Dorset Climate Action Network (DCAN) is organising and hosting the first Dorset COP (Conference of Parties) It is Dorset's "very own opportunity for the community to have its say on the climate and ecological crises. By bringing together a wide cross section of community-based groups from across the county we hope to raise awareness of the need and desire to act locally, in a way that puts people at the heart of decisions and is socially just." It will be held at The Corn exchange in Dorchester bringing together representatives from many of the 200 or so groups across Dorset working on aspects of the climate and ecological emergency. There will be speakers, workshops and chances to network. It is hoped that this will become an annual event. A 'Declaration' will be made at the end of the conference. The conference has been endorsed by Chris Packham, the BBC naturalist and campaigner, with a message of support.

With the election looming nine months away this my last year as a Parish Councillor. Life as a Councillor hasn't been anything like I imagined when I stood for election nearly four years ago. My poorly informed thinking had me spending a few hours keeping the village a good place to live, perhaps a few extra flower beds, maybe a new bench or two, some community or AONB initiatives etc. Reality has been quite different to my imaginings.

At one of my very first Council meetings a volunteer was sought to attend an Environment Agency flood meeting. Nobody was keen to make the trip to Blandford Forum so, knowing nothing, I put my hand up, and from that day forth, like it or not, I became the Council's de facto flood representative! It has been a rocky ride as anything involving the stream divides local opinion as we strive to balance flood risk management with ecology concerns. We have made a few cautious steps forward, for example, we have made sure the autumn stream clearance is now done sensitively, by hand, rather than as we had done for years previously using a mechanical digger. There is also a plucky band of villagers who volunteer to get in there and clear minor blockages, as and when needed, to whom I am indebted especially as I can no longer get down and dirty in the stream. I have had to recognise my recent mobility issues have made me poorly suited to the flood role and I have just handed on the flood baton to Councillor Raphaella Rookes who is certainly fitter!

My particular interest is in engagement and transparency; I have focussed a lot of my energies in that direction particularly in organising, along with Deborah Follet, the 2021 village survey. When a long-standing Councillor threatened to resign over a proposed spending plan for a much needed website, I stepped up, again with Deborah's help, we developed a free website. Over the last couple of years we have established, I hope, a simple, but useful Council

website with some real information, planning notices, historical records, a newsfeed, etc. As with everything there is always room for improvement so do get back to me if you have any ideas or suggestions.

We have aspired to make our comments process for planning applications a little more transparent. All applications we receive are now posted on the website and you can be notified of new applications automatically by signing up to our newsfeed. We now meet 11 times per year so we can we discuss the majority of applications in public whenever possible. We only get 3 weeks to comment on applications so it is inevitable some applications need to be commented in advance of the public meeting; we always try to gauge the view of villagers in preparing our comments.

Villager attendance at Council meetings is invariably in the low single figures; I am always disappointed that I haven't done enough to engage with you all. Many of those villagers attending meetings do so only as they have an interest in a particular agenda item, often their own, or a neighbour's planning application. The Council gets some criticisms, particularly so in the parish survey, these are welcome as at least a sign of some engagement; one has to be watching our operations to be able to criticise!

In the last year we have been lucky enough to gain some new Councillors, family people with young children; we hope this makes us a little bit more representative of the community. For the Parish Council to be truly representative we need to involve the community and see more of you bring influence to bear on our decisionmaking. We have endeavoured to make things more engaging for you but we are a long way from succeeding; it's quite a rare event for a villager to get in touch with a Councillor let alone attend a meeting. If you have any thoughts on what more we can do please get in touch.




