THOUGHTS FROM THE DESK OF...

The fourth Sunday of Lent is set-aside in the Church's calendar for 'Mothering Sunday' (also known as 'Refreshment Sunday'). It's a timely respite from the stringencies of Lent as we relax whatever sacrifice we may have made for the six-week period of Lent – break out the chocolate! In the 16th century, Mothering Sunday was less about mothers and more about church. Back then, people would make a journey to their 'mother' church once a year. This might have been their home church, their nearest cathedral or a major parish church in a bigger town. The service that took place at the 'mother' church symbolised the coming together of families. Another tradition was to allow those working in the fields on wealthy farms and estates to have the day off on the fourth Sunday of Lent to visit their mothers and possibly go to church too. This was a variation on the theme of visiting the 'mother' church and was a move towards a more family focussed occasion.

I wonder what your understanding of Mother is? How we identify with 'mother' will very much depend on our experiences of childhood. 'Mother' may bring memories of warmth and love or sadly, for some, coldness and neglect. In fact there must be as many perceptions of 'mother' as there are people. I once gave a talk to the Mothers' Union of a church in Bournemouth. There were two men amongst the group and I naturally assumed that they were accompanying their wives, but I was wrong. They too were members of the Mothers' Union, as was the vicar of that church who is also a man. (I mention this to make the point that I certainly don't believe that the concept of 'mothering', defined as 'the nurturing and raising of a child', applies only to the female gender.)

'Mothers Day' has become a massive commercial enterprise. It's hard to ignore the advertisements for flowers and gifts or the restaurants vying for our business to take our mum's out for a lovely lunch – all to show our appreciation for the love that our mothers show to us. I'm not criticising that by the way, but I wonder, does it detract somewhat from a truer, deeper meaning of 'mother'.

The church encourages us to look at motherhood in an altogether more intense way in comparison to the commercial viewpoint of "your mum loves you so show her you love her by buying her a big bunch flowers". However we may personally identify with 'mother', on Mothering Sunday we look to one mother for our understanding – to Mary the mother of Jesus.

Love is most definitely at the core of the message of the Gospel but a mother's love, and most especially the love that Mary demonstrated, for God and for Jesus, is a love beyond love, a love that is demonstrated by costly self-sacrifice.

So this Mothering Sunday (19th March) come and celebrate all that is wonderful about mothers and mothering at a special family service in St Martin's Church, Martinstown – with posies of daffodils for all!



Since our last meeting, the Winterborne has continued to rise to very high levels. Over 50 day's worth of tankers pumping out and a 'Dry January' have now seen the level drop quite considerably.

The Parish Council has upped their pressure on Wessex Water for data about the releases of untreated waste from the Pumping Station and the possibility of replacing the sewer in the near future. The Chair has published official figures for the short period up to New Year and this does not include any seepage from drains etc. When tested the seepage is 95% water however, it is the 5% which we are very concerned about. We have lodged complaints to the Environment Agency who have the power to impose large penalties. It is no consolation but there are many villages in Dorset in a similar situation as Winterborne St Martin. Figures released for Thames Water show that 146 places where a similar problem occurs. WW do not publish their data as freely.

Wessex Water have said that we are in line for a full relining of the sewer throughout the village. Extensive camera work will need to take place before this can happen and it may take up to 12 months to complete. They cannot make a start at present because of the flow of sewage passing through the system would render the pictures useless. We will have to wait until the summer I fear.

Work continues to improve the Village Green with the planting of a Jubilee Tree in the near future. This is on top of the siting of an electrical point for council related activities on the Garage. Which neatly brings me to the point that the garage has been successfully let to a resident.

Sealed bids were opened at the January meeting.

We have the King's Coronation later this year and the Council are keen to support any person or body who wishes to lead on this. Our Annual Parish Meeting will also be in May but the Bank Holiday situation needs to be looked at in depth. The meeting is likely to be on a Friday night in the Village Hall.

I am sad to say that Cllr Follet has stepped down as of 31st January. Deborah has been the instigator of several initiatives (Christmas Tree for one) and a lead on the Winterborne clearance. This year we are all especially thankful to her and Jon for doing such a good job.

We are in the process of settling in a new Clerk, Marion Baird, who will be a great credit to us once she is au fait with the systems and the foibles of the councillors.

"For everyone, forever".

This is how the biggest conservation charity in Europe describes its cause and Emma Ayling, Senior Volunteering and Community Officer at the National Trust spoke to us on 16th January about what that means for the portfolio in North and West Dorset

We heard how Octavia Hill, a pioneering thinker and social reformer and one the three founders of the National T believed in the importance of access to nature for human wellbeing and the need to stop the destruction of t natural landscape. House are two examples and we learned about the work done to maintain them. Similarly, Clouds Hill, the country cottage TE Lawrence moved into 100 years ago this year has been cared for by skilled conservationists tackling

> humidity, pests, light exposure and specialist cleaning of the furniture and art.

Hardy's cottage and Max Gate were given

similar treatment and we heard how the Trust is working on having the contents of Hardy's study returned to Max Gate from the Dorchester Hardy Centre.

Emma shared the outdoors work of the archeology rangers across the local National Trust land and the restoration of the Hill Forts habitats, implementing management plans to monitor conditions and maintain the ecology. The work of the gardening teams were covered and we discovered how the visitor experience

managers have been encouraging the best possible experiences, with new walks making the countryside accessible. This included making Trampers (mobility scooters built for all-terrain use) available for hire to access Golden Cap and Hive Beach. If that's not enough to get anyone outside, then how about Masterchef winner Matt Follas leading you in foraging expeditions with



the National Trust?!

The presentation contained a wealth of vivid images creating an entertaining presentation, made all the more so by the enthusiastically added snippets provided by Emma's National Trust colleague, Keith, who happened to also be her husband...!

I wasn't alone in feeling inspired to visit or revisit some of the amazing properties. Some may even answer the call for more volunteers.

Turning to upcoming events, we have the AGM on the 20th March, when Tom and Chloe Marsh from Eweleaze Organic Dairy Farm will share their story. Find out how the team that brought us the local milk vending outlet created their organic system with an eye on sustainability and became a supplier to the multinational Müller brand. The AGM will also be an opportunity for us to thank Angela Barrett and Jill Empson for their long service on the Committee and also to Clive Willetts who has acted as examiner of our accounts for 17 years.

In breaking news, we now have a chosen venue and date for this year's village outing! After a close contest the final deciding vote was for Beaulieu and that is all set for the 22nd June. More details to come.

Shelter Shelte

Please support the quiz on Friday, 10 March 2023 at 7pm in Martinstown Village Hall. The quiz is being held to raise funds for the charity SHELTERBOX. ShelterBox is a charity that delivers aid to families devasted by conflict and disaster, to give them durable shelter and the tools to rebuild. £30 could provide a family with

a sleeping mat and thermal blankets, £60 a water filter giving access to clean drinking water, £350 a strong, family sized tent, while £590 provides a tent, solar lights, water filter, cooking sets, blankets and mats. All shelter box kits are customised to meet the individual needs of each community they help, often supplying such items as timber, corrugated iron, tarpaulin and rope.

A series of powerful earthquakes have devastated southern Türkiye (formerly Turkey) and northern Syria. Thousands of buildings have collapsed leaving people homeless in the middle of a bitter winter. ShelterBox is responding by providing emergency shelter for families affected by these earthquakes. Survivors are in dire need of support; the type of support that SHELTERBOX can provide. Please come along and have a great evening of entertainment knowing that every penny you spend is going to help keep people in need alive. 

Martinstown Open Gardens will be returning this year, for the




This evening Ced and Louisa are in charge of the raffle and our barmaid is Annie - here she comes to organise the bar. The audience start to arrive.


