Valley and Valence such an appropriate name for our parish mag. I've lived in "Cumton" for over thirty years, but still sometimes think of myself as a newcomer. Such is the long history of our small community. I suspect we qualify as one of the smallest villages in Dorset (based on a village requiring a church), but once visited never forgotten.

The village is recorded in the Doomsday Book as Contone, with 25 households, one of the larger settlements of the time, but a very similar number to today!

The origins of the name is Cumb = in a valley, and Tun = town. Valence comes from the Lord of the Manor who was William of Valence, Lord Pembroke in the thirteenth century. Slightly earlier the village was known as Cumpton Pundelarge, which I guess derives from our not so large village pond! In 1811 we were briefly East Compton, but that didn't stick.

Back to the present day, we're proud to be part of the Winterbourne Benefice and the wider Dorchester Team. As a new warden some years back I was told an Interregnum was an opportunity for the Laity to step up and reflect on our role within the church. I now realise that there is much truth in this, but it is also a time to draw on the help of others, and I would like to thank Keith, Heidi and Allen for taking our services.

Please don't wait till Snowdrops to come and visit us.



The Merchant of St Martin - so much more than a shop.

Grumble time but with a serious message.

Our initial goal was that the shop would continue to develop as an integral part of village life, providing a convenient range of merchandise, from basics to more luxury items, but as importantly, becoming a meeting place for the community.

However, as a business, there are several issues that need to be addressed.

Most village shops rely on volunteers to survive. Unfortunately, apart from the stalwart few, with us from the beginning, we have been unable to recruit more. This has a negative impact on our cost structure, as we rely on paid staff to keep open.

As we know, many local businesses are struggling, and will only survive if supported by the community. Our village shop is in the same situation - running costs are not being covered by the turnover.

Are you shopping with us? Even in a small

way? We cannot survive on selling newspapers, bread, and milk alone, but spending £5 a week in a small local shop has a greater impact than if spent in a large retail outlet or chain.

Do the residents of the Winterborne valley and beyond, want a village shop? The response when we began, and still is, an overwhelming YES! The village shop is seen as being at the heart of the community.

However, the footfall says otherwise.

Griping done! But unfortunately, it means we must save some costs, and this means reducing the opening hours.

Beginning 1st November, the shop will no longer be open on Sundays.

Monday to Saturday, the opening hours will be from 8 am to 3 pm.

We look forward to seeing you soon.

NEVVS NOVEMBER 23

This has been an interesting period in a number of ways, not least the now regular autumnal migration of the Clerk, but my theme here will be the planning approval process, rumours of corruption, and the inevitable plea for people to join us as councillors.

There have recently been a number of interesting planning applications, and wherever possible the Clerk has gained us permission to consider them openly at our meetings, inviting the comments of interested parties before the Council takes a view on whether to support, oppose or remain neutral on an application. The Parish Council is merely one consultee of the planning authority – Dorset Council, although provided we stick to material and relevant matters our view does seem to be given some weight by the Authority.

In one case recently I heard the suggestion, third hand naturally, that the Council, or Councillors had acted corruptly in dealing with a planning matter. I have two responses to this, firstly if anyone wishes to seriously suggest that something like this has occurred, they should report it, either to the Clerk (as Proper Officer) or to the Monitoring Officer at Dorset Council. Secondly, and facetiously, I'm disappointed that if this is going on nobody has ever offered me anything in return for my vote! However, the point might have been that very few Councillors have been seen to vote, and if the result has not been what was desired the inference might be that some or all of the Councillors have been swayed. Whilst

we have had a few councillors indisposed recently, we have always been quorate, and we could have more members voting if anyone else was prepared to be co-opted as a Councillor. So, your opportunity to influence what is best for our Parish is but an application form away...

In other matters, we move on in gaining legal control of the Memorial Hall/Reading Room, and looking ahead, at November's meeting we will set the budget for 23-24 which will of course include a recommendation on the required precept. So, if you have a view on what we should be spending your money on, and how much of it we should spend, now might be a good time to raise it.

As always we welcome feedback on the Council's activities so please feel free to speak to any of the Councillors or contact us officially through our Clerk – clerk@ winterbornestmartin-pc.gov.uk.

As a Council we are committed to following Dorset Council in moves towards being "paperless" so the majority of documents are now published on our website www. winterbornestmartin-pc.gov.uk/community/winterborne-st-martin-parish-council-18643/home/.

Chetnole with Stile... by Martin Usherwood

Fresh from the Mileaters Tour of Dartmoor an intrepid number (18) of the group turned out to tick off another area of Dorset and get to the pub before Storm Agnes arrived. From the Chetnole



that the Cerne Abbas Giant is a depiction of Edwold. St Edwold's Day is the 29th Aug.

From the Church there is a very pleasant flat(ish)walk back towards Chetnole. But first,

our esteemed President decreed that in true tradition we would follow the correct path across a ploughed field to the Sheaf of Arrows before turning for home. In so doing we reinstated the footpath for the farmer free of charge. The walk is about 5 miles but would have been shorter had a footbridge contained the necessary planks. However, the diversion allowed those with muddy boots to wash them by fording the stream.

All along the walk we encountered some impressive Oak trees with huge acorns. There must be some very chunky squirrels in these parts, not to be messed with unless you are in the WI. Once again crossing the railway led us back to the Inn 15 mins later than my estimate.

Did I mention the stiles? Apparently, there is a prize for the walk containing the largest number of stiles. When one pre-walks a route, a few stiles doesn't make much of a difference. When a group attempts the same walk it can make a huge difference. All those creaking hips and grinding knee joints, a sound not for the faint hearted. I think there were 10 stiles in all. However, we were able to walk around one and used the two gates at the railway crossing instead, so 7 seems a good number to set as a target with only a few months left of this year.

Inn our early route lulled the group into a false sense of security, it being mainly flat grassland. Then came a section which took in the only bit of hillside for some miles. Following the Hardy Way we ventured, out of breath, to the summit and plunged down into the lovely little hamlet of Melbury Bubb. Sounds better if you say it as Blackadder would, with emphasis on the final B's. Hardy called this place Little Hintock in "The Woodlanders". There is a church here with an extraordinary font on which the animals are carved upside down. This font had been part of a large cross once which has been repurposed. Oil lamps adorn the walls and a huge log burner the entrance.

After a coffee break we regained height on the Hardy Way before descending to the next church.

I don't think calling someone 'The Grand Old Duke of York' was warranted after all it was only about 100' in actual vertical height! Passing the trig point gives one a fine view towards the NW into Somerset (well, on a clear day perhaps). The path took us to the uniquely named Church of St Edwold, said to be one of the oldest in Dorset. Measuring 30'x12'. Edwold was a hermit who came to Cerne Abbas and started the Hermitage by the Silver Well. Recently, it has been suggested



This year is likely to be the hottest ever recorded, sea ice is melting more rapidly, biodiversity is falling. The effects of these factors may not immediately seem to affect us but...

Dorset COP September 9th

Groups and individuals concerned with sustainable, ecological and issues were able to meet and enhance working partnerships. Over 250 attended, including people from Martinstown. There was a range of workshops. lectures and activities that focused on how citizens can take action themselves and demand action from our leaders. At current rates of progress the Climate Emergency is not going away. Unless humans can act globally and locally we are all in for a rough time over the next 40 years.

Great Big Dorset Hedge

GM has been working with Dorset Climate Action Network (DCAN) and landowners to survey hedges in the parish. This should provide information leading to more hedgerows and better management. This will lead to better places for wildlife and plants to live and a more vibrant landscape.

Citizen Science and dirty water

Volunteers have begun a monthly survey of the stream from Abbas to West Stafford, testing for solids and chemicals. The results are forwarded to the relevant authorities. Hopefully this will inform and encourage Wessex Water to take more steps to improve water quality.

Ponds in the parish

GM offers advice, person power and financial assistance for anyone wishing to make a pond for their garden. Take-up has been low so far so there is plenty of opportunity to benefit. The advantages for wildlife are massive and a pond provides a wonderful place to sit by and relax.

Next steps

GM seeks to raise awareness of how we can all live more sustainably and make this village's contribution to reducing problems we face. Partners include the Village Hall Committee. the Parish Council and DCAN. We have an ongoing conversation with Dorset Council about providing more amenities in the valley. Any ideas, big or small, will be very welcome.

Green Living Project

Get together with four to six neighbours/friends or people you don't know. Meet up seven times for a meal or drinks, maybe taking turns to host. A detailed information pack will help you check how sustainable your lives are and importantly point up how you can reduce your energy and material needs. Discussion will focus on your homes and your lifestyle. Topics include food, energy, transport, waste, water and community. Incidentally, as a result, you will find more space and lower costs of living.

PLEASE NOTE HOWEVER that the legendary Christmas Lunch this year will be on **FRIDAY 15th December**.






