FROM THE
DESK OF...

All good gifts around us are sent from heaven above; then thank the Lord, O thank the Lord, for all his love.

We sing these word as the chorus to the familiar hymn, "We plough the fields and scatter", at our Harvest Festival services. The central theme of the hymn is being thankful to God for all God's goodness and for all that we receive from God. At this time of the year we are particularly thankful to God for the harvest which has been and will be gathered in from the fields that surround us and also for the harvest that comes from further afield. We are thankful to God for our food, for those who have grown and harvested it and for those who have transported it to us from around our country and around the world.

Thankfulness is a gift from God. It is the ability to appreciate all that we receive from God and from other people with a generous and open heart. It is not something that we turn on and off depending on how we are feeling. It is a way of being that comes about because of the gift we have received from God. It is not a decision we make, whether or not to be thankful. We are thankful people. That is our default setting.

We are thankful people all year round and during the season of Harvest, our particular focus is being thankful to God for the harvest of food we enjoy all year round. As we enjoy the richness of God's provision, we should also be mindful of those who do not have the relative abundance that we enjoy. In our villages and in our neighbouring town there will be people who struggle. A daily question for them might not be "What shall we eat?" It might be, "Can we afford to eat?" Part of the sense of celebration and thankfulness we have should also include a sense of compassion and generosity towards others. This might be shown through supporting local food banks. This might also be through supporting a charity such as The Trussell Trust, that seeks to combat hunger and food poverty.

As we sing our Harvest hymns of thankfulness, we pray that God will help us to continue to discover new ways and reasons, to be thankful and to enable others to receive and share in this precious gift from God.



News from PCSO Sarah...

Dear Readers

As your local PCSO I am still patrolling although you may not of seen me as regularly as you would like.

This is due to a number of factors but I am always contactable as are other members of the Neighbourhood policing team via -DORCHESTER NPT LINK: Dorchester | Your area | Dorset Police | Dorset Police or via CONTACT US LINK: Contact us | Dorset Police

PLEASE NOTE

- Silent 999 calls have increased and the large majority of these are "pocket dials". If taking your phone out with you, please ensure that the screen/keypad is locked, to avoid any unnecessary calls.

If you accidentally dial 999, please do not hang up. If possible, please stay on the line and let the operator know it was an accident and that you do not need any assistance. Silent calls to 999 are never just ignored.

Nationally, all emergency services are experiencing record high 999 call volumes. which is believed has been impacted because of an update to Android smartphones.

The update, issued between October 2022 and February 2023, added a new SOS emergency function for devices to call 999 through the power button being pressed five times or more on devices.

If you have an Android phone, you can check your emergency settings to turn off the functionality added in the latest update, if you wish to.

Go to 'settings' then 'safety and emergency' and slide the button which says 'emergency SOS' to switch the functionality off.

Improving the way, you contact us

We receive thousands of digital contacts from residents and visitors every month and contact overall to Dorset Police has recently been reaching record levels.

It is important for us to use the best systems and processes to ensure emergency lines are kept open and non-emergency calls can be answered from those who are unable to contact us online

We have been looking at ways to ensure we can meet the needs of our communities as quickly as possible as well as ensuring that members of the public are directed to the correct agency, such as the local authority, who may be best placed to deal with their request for service.

Following the launch of our new website in March, we have seen a huge increase in the quality of information captured on digital reports completed via our website, ensuring we are able to record crimes effectively and task officers and staff appropriately

- Why are we making these changes?

We are asking members of the public to use these web forms when contacting us digitally instead of sending an email to ensure we have all the relevant information we need and can respond as efficiently as possible - meaning we get you the advice, information and help you need as soon as possible.

Our non-emergency email was withdrawn from 5 June 2023 and digital contact should be made via our website - CONTACT US LINK: Contact us Dorset Police

Alternatively, you can still contact us for nonemergency enquiries by calling 101.

So far, I have found this interesting and engaging, and in becoming an active member of the council, I have been able to join the working groups for gaining back control of the Reading Room, as well as The Staffing Committee, and I have now joined the Budget Working Group.

Since joining the Parish Council, I've found it to be an intriguing learning curve, trying to work out how the council functions; with things like motions/proposals, policies, spending/budgets, local planning applications are dealt with. Councillors Andy Daw and Richard Eversden removed the tree root beside the bridge. This was in preparation for the repair works to the bridge to be undertaken by a local stonemason.




