Since the Rev'd Jean left the role, this gap has been filled by the Rector of our Benefice, Rev'd Keith (Team Rector), with support from Rev'd Heidi, and others from outside and within our Parishes.

Our thanks are due to them and particularly to Rev'd Jo for her work at Abbas, to Allen and Peter for all their work in Martinstown and Steepleton and to the Church Wardens, Joy, David, Dick, Ellie, Peter and Jeremy.

What happens next? We are, hopefully, on our way to having a new Vicar. Until then, everything will be kept going by the team above supported by members of the PCC and other people - both churchgoers and church supporters who feel strongly that they wish to keep our churches running in our four villages. Happily the Churches extend beyond their physical boundaries and into our communities, through this publication, events and services on the Martinstown Green, home visits, Messy Church, The Food Bank, The Community Larder, Carols in the Pub and many other means.

Like his/her three predecessors, our new Team Vicar will be unpaid, but in a 'house for duty' post. This requires them to live in the Rectory in Martinstown in exchange for nominally two days of work (plus Sundays) to plan for four churches. They may be priests, but they are not magicians and need our support to carry this out. We look forward to welcoming our new 'Reverend'!

March 2024 was a busy month in the church calendar. The forty days of Lent, which started on Ash Wednesday in February ended on Good Friday, when we remembered the crucifixion of Jesus. And on the last day of March we celebrated Easter Sunday, the day of resurrection, when Jesus was raised from death.

This year, the first day of April begins another period of 40 days, this time spanning the time between Easter Sunday and Ascension Day, when Jesus, after appearing in bodily form to his disciples and friends on a number of occasions, is taken up into heaven.


Ten days later, this year on 19 May, Pentecost, also known as Whitsun, marks the coming of the Holy Spirit, which gave strength and power to Jesus's followers enabling them to proclaim the message of love for everyone, Jew and Gentile. Thus, that first Pentecost is regarded as the day the Christian Church was born.

But what did the disciples and those men and women who had followed Jesus through his ministry do, and what did they feel and think during that time? They would certainly have had many questions and doubts; wondering why the person they had perceived as their saviour, come to liberate them from Roman oppression, had to die. 'Why did God not intervene?' 'What were they to do so next?'

People continue to ask these questions, and many more and would almost certainly add, 'Why does God allow wars, conflicts and the suffering of innocent people to continue?' Perhaps in these past two years particularly and in so many parts of the world those questions will be on the minds of many.

In our parish some of us meet as a small group every two weeks, to read the Bible, to share our thoughts, responses and experiences and try to understand more about God. We don't find easy answers, but our knowledge and understanding grows. We learn from each other and from having a time and space to think together.

# NEVVS APRIL 2024

#### **Ongoing Concerns**

Almost 20 years ago, due to my robust objection to an attempted land grab, I was asked to be a parish councillor, I was co-opted and sat at my first meeting. The concerns raised by parishioners were – Mcdonalds, speeding, flooding, tractors...

**Mcdonalds** - Bought what was formally a greasy spoon roadside cafe, so planning had already been gained.

Many have asked over the years, why doesn't the Duchy give them some land for parking, the fact is that the Duchy warned of the problems at the outset so why should they now be expected to sort them out?

Speeding - We have tried many ways to reduce speeding, the district council restricts us to were we can install a speed indicator devise (SID) and we had to install monitoring points at a cost of £400 each to prove where a device was necessary, which in our case was only Mallards Green, 7 years ago with the DC as the sole suppliers, we purchased a SID at approx £3000 and the mounting poles at £250 each, unfortunately the SID has now broken but the votes are in and money set aside for repair.

**Flooding** - Years ago the DC did the river maintenance and then decided they would only do the road side of the river, leaving riparian owners to do theirs, and then it seems both sides decided to do none at all.

After the 2012 floods a group of volunteers from Winterbourne, Steepleton and Martinstown was formed to jointly help maintain the river, after a few years there was a dispute which left Martinstown on their own, somehow the Martinstown PC made themselves responsible for maintenance and we now pay a contractor £2500 a year to maintain parts of the river which should be done by riparian owners. Ongoing

**Tractors** - We are a farming village so we should expect tractors but they have become bigger and bigger and have destroyed the verges, we ask the

farmers to be considerate, but still don't have a solution.

#### **New Concerns**

**Wessex Water -** We continue to hassle WW over the sewage overflows and check there records, one which amazed me was the number of times they discharge into the river when the pumping station can't cope. Fertile land at Monkton I would guess?

#### Proposed development west of Dukes close

- We were asked to a meeting a few years ago by an affordable housing developer to approve a development in the field west of Dukes close, which we supported in principle, several developers later we are faced with a proposed development of retail houses with the minimum of affordable's which we are strongly objecting too, one being the extra sewage!

Reading room/parish office - In the 1920s the RR was given to the village in a deed of trust, for the good of the village with four nominated trustees, after many years and the deaths of the trustees it would appear that it was abandoned and then taken over by a builder who used it as an office. When he vacated the building in the early 90s the PC took control and used it as the parish office, we are in the process of trying to obtain legal title through adverse possession.

Village Green - Many years ago, in their naivety in my opinion, the PC rented the village green from the owner, thus removing the cost of maintenance from the owner to the PC, we learned recently after complaints about parking that the area in front of Fishers Barn is registered as part of the village green, therefore open space for the enjoyment of all villagers, which also applies to the area in front of the church and carries a hefty fine for anyone driving over or parking on the land, and would appear to be non negotiable.

Please give the message at the top some consideration.

The **composting** area in the churchyard is a community resource & anyone in the village is welcome to both add to the bins & take away bags of compost. There is guidance at the site to let you know how it works.

The **recycling** collections for tetrapaks, foil & plastic tops are well used. The tetrapak & foil bins are emptied twice a week by two volunteers. Please follow the instructions. Those who can are encouraged to take their own recycling to the bins in the Fairfield car park or at the tip. Just one volunteer manages the bottle tops. Recently two bags of these went to Beaminster school for projects in the resistant materials class.

#### Spring is in the air:

The **flowers** at the bus stop opposite the playground are getting more established. The snowdrops were lovely, followed by the narcissi, and now the wild garlic & bluebells are coming through.

**Hedgehogs** are likely to start emerging from hibernation now. Whilst they are still tucked up in their winter nests take care not to disturb them as you start to tackle your gardens. If you do disturb them, don't handle or move them, just cover them over again & leave them alone.

Those families that made bird boxes last year are hopefully seeing blue tits & great tits showing interest & building nests. If you have any questions please contact Andy Daw (889433).

With spring our frogs & toads need to find a pond to lay their eggs in. If you could find space for a small pond in your garden, Green Martinstown members can help you plan, dig and plant your pond if you need a hand, along with a financial contribution to help you with the cost of materials.

The stream survey along the Winterbourne continues. We are maintaining the 70 Platinum Jubilee trees at Grove Hill. Some are even showing their heads above the tree guards.





### A Dogs Tail - sorry, Tale.

Hello good people - my name is Boris -No! - not that one. I am a long haired terrier and my grandad was a patterdale terrier with the local hunt so I have good breeding!

My first home was in Devon on a small farm in the Dart valley and they had a deer hound



that was however far too proud to mix with me but their cat loved me and we had great fun chasing each other round the garden and farm vard. I therefore like cats - but not many like me!

We moved to Martinstown fairly recently and were very pleased to find lovely walks in all directions. My lady owner, I will call her 'She', loves walking and insists on doing 10,000 steps a day which suites me, except when it is cold and wet. I am now about 15 years old and recently lost my eye sight and hearing but can still have a good sense of smell and can easily follow her scent on our walks.

I am always kept on a lead in the village but off the roads 'She' lets me off the lead and I trot along behind her following her scent. Just 'back along', as they say in Devon, when near a farm, I picked up the scent of cats and thought they would like to meet me. I followed their scent into the farm yard and they disappeared -probably climbed up into the barns. 'She' did not miss me for a while as her eyesight is also not good and she has to concentrate on the track to avoid tripping over stones. Suddenly 'She' realised that I was not following her and had no idea where I had gone. 'She' used her phone to contact the family and a search commenced with several other dog walkers joining in included the lovely lady in a wheel chair who lives near us and gives me treats.

I wondered back through the farm yard towards the path over a flat area of very green grass but it suddenly collapsed under my weight and I was in a rather smelly fluid called, I think, slurry! Unlike most terriers I do not bark so I just screamed and it was a very long time before a lovely girl on the farm heard me and spread the news. A crowd gathered and the fire brigade arrived but did not have the correct equipment with them to rescue me. I was of course very tired at this this time and having difficulty with keeping my nose above the slurry. 'She' and all the others were distraught but were unable to help.

Next to arrive was the farmer called Noel in a big teleporter machine but the extended bucket could not reach me. His very brave son Tom climbed into the bucket and with a net on the end of a very long pole managed to 'fish' me out. What a relief! I had been in the slurry for over two hours and would not have lasted much longer.

In the farm yard the ladies hosed me off and after profuse thanks to all that had helped 'She' took me home and I had the first proper bath of my long life.

I am now fully recovered and 'She' has bought one of those extendable dog leads so I will never get lost again. I am of course extremely grateful to all those that helped me including the fire brigade, the dog walkers and of course all those lovely people from the farm.






